Build Others Up – We listen with respect and walk alongside our neighbors.



Message from the Executive Director

This year reminded us that hope is something we feed together.

When the Perry Outreach Center reopened as a new independent, 501(c)3 nonprofit last fall, we faced steep challenges — rising food costs, the loss of church support, and the lingering effects of a three-month closure. Yet our neighbors returned, volunteers showed up, and donors helped keep the lights on. Since October, nearly 300 families have come through our doors. We watched participants receive fresh produce and receive blood pressure checks for the first time in months.

Just a quick note to all that read this report. The POC operates in the most underserved zip code in the State of Michigan. We have over three thousand individuals in our client files. Volunteerism is the lifeblood of our organization. Shirley Chisholm wrote *“Service is the rent we pay for the privilege of living on this earth.”* We want you; we need you.



